- 1. By December 31, 2002, recruit, orient and retain a pool of 300 donor professionals who provide no-cost services to children in need.**

During the first quarter, three thousand donor solicitation letters were mailed and 500 follow-up calls were made. Staff also participated in community networking and educational opportunities at 15 professional organization meetings, health fairs and other events. So far, 137 professionals have agreed to donate time to the project. Three orientation meetings have been scheduled for the second quarter. Challenges have included obtaining current mailing lists, updating mailing addresses, and getting busy professionals to respond to phone messages.

- 2. By December 31, 2002, match 300 referred children with donor professionals who provide them with needed goods and services.**

83 referrals for services were made during the first quarter. Case management was provided to the parents of 48 of these children to begin coordination of professional services.
